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KAPI Association's Grant-Making Policy and Procedure Document

Although the Küresel Eşitlik ve Kapsayıcılık Ağı Derneği (KAPI) is not currently operating as a direct grant-making entity, the organization commits to the following principles and procedures in the event that a sub-granting mechanism is required as part of the UN Women Call for Proposals (CFP).

1. Principles of Grant-Making

- Grants shall be awarded to organizations that demonstrate a strong commitment to gender equality, human rights, and non-discrimination.
- Eligibility will be assessed based on organizational capacity, relevant experience, and connection to the target communities.
- KAPI prioritizes grassroots organizations and community-based initiatives led by or serving vulnerable groups.

2. Application and Selection Process

- Transparent calls for applications will be issued.
- An independent selection committee will be formed to evaluate proposals based on clear criteria.
- Selected grantees will sign a formal agreement outlining objectives, budgets, and monitoring responsibilities.

3. Monitoring and Reporting

- Sub-grantees will be required to submit regular interim and final reports.
- KAPI may conduct site visits, offer technical assistance, and provide capacity-building support.
- Performance and impact will be tracked through qualitative and quantitative indicators.

4. Financial Oversight and Anti-Fraud Compliance

- All sub-grantees must agree to adhere to UN Women's Anti-Fraud and Anti-Corruption Policy.
- Financial documentation (invoices, bank transfers, receipts) must be maintained and submitted for review.
- Any misuse or irregularity will result in termination of the grant and possible recovery of funds.

5. Participation and Inclusion

- Grant-making processes will prioritize entities representing or serving marginalized groups including young women, women with disabilities, and LGBTQI+ individuals.
- Evaluation will be guided by the principles of diversity, equity, and inclusive representation.
